# POPULAIR CHANGES TERMINAL AT STOCKHOLM ARLANDA

On October 1, 2024, populAir will switch to Terminal 3 for all arrivals and departures at Stockholm Arlanda Airport. This means the following for you as a traveler.

# **Online Check-in**

Digital check-in is done via the company's website, www.populair.com or https://reservations.populair.com/check-in/search. It opens 36 hours before departure and closes 2 hours before the flight's departure time. If you're traveling with only hand luggage, go directly to Security Check at Terminal 3.

If you have baggage to check in, you need to do this at the check-in counters as described below.

# **Check-in via counter**

Check-in takes place at the square between Terminal 2 and Terminal 3. The check-in opens 90 minutes before departure and closes 40 minutes before the flight's departure time. Counters 58–60. After that, you proceed down the corridor to Terminal 3, pass the security check, and then head to the gate for your flight.

#### **Arriving in Stockholm**

When arriving by flight to Terminal 3, you go directly into the terminal from the aircraft. Baggage is collected at the baggage claim area in Terminal 3. Afterwards, it's a short walk to the bus or taxi, which are located outside the entrance to Terminal 2. For continued travel with Arlanda Express, there are elevators or escalators down to the station next to the square between Terminals 2 and 3.

# Arrival for Transfer Passengers (continuing with SAS)

When arriving from Ö-vik to Terminal 3, you enter the terminal directly from the aircraft. After that, you can get to Terminal 5 in several ways:

#### Transferbus from Terminal 2

If you've already checked in for your next flight and have checked your baggage through or are traveling without baggage, go to security check at Terminal 2 and then to gate 61C, which is a transfer gate. Using the bell at the gate, you can call for pick-up. The bus will arrive within 7–15 minutes. The bus serves Transfer Gate T11 at the connection corridor between Gate Area C and other terminals in Terminal 5, as well as Gate F5 in Terminal 5.

# Pass through Security at former Terminal 4

If you and your baggage are already checked in, you can also pass through security at Terminal 4, which is close to Terminal 3.

# Walk

Walking between Terminal 3 and 5 takes about 20 minutes, according to Swedavia's estimates

# Train

It's free to use the Arlanda Express between Terminals 2/3 and Terminal 5. The train ride between the stations takes about 1-2 minutes.

#### Arrival for Transfer Passengers with SAS, flying onward with populAir to Örnsköldsvik

Passengers arriving on SAS flights with interline (through tickets) can take the transfer bus from Gate F5 to Terminal 2 and pass customs before proceeding to Terminal 3 and passing through security. You can also pass through customs at Terminal 5 and either walk or take the train to Terminal 3.

# Arrival for Transfer Passengers with other airlines, flying onward with populAir to Örnsköldsvik

You collect your baggage at Terminal 5, pass through customs, and then either walk or take the train to Terminal 3, where check-in takes place as described above. Passengers arriving without baggage can pass through customs at Terminal 5 or take the transfer bus from Gate F5 to Terminal 2, pass customs, and then proceed to Terminal 3 and pass through security.

#### **Information about Terminal 3**

Terminal 3 is a quick and convenient terminal for flight arrivals and departures, with short distances to taxis, buses, trains, and pick-up spots outside Terminals 2 and 4. Terminal 3 has recently been refreshed, and several workspaces have been added for travelers to use. There is also a small restaurant/café in the terminal (which will open shortly before or after the opening of Terminal 3) as well as vending machines if you want something to eat or drink.

Transfer buses between Terminals 2 and 5 run daily between 05:30–22:00 for travel within the Schengen area.

The terminal change is due to the fact that it is the airport operator, Swedavia, that determines which terminal each airline will operate from.
